Description

Every day, thousands of people are killed or injured at work which can create significant problems for employers due to loss of staff, financial loss, fines, raised insurance premiums, reputational damage as well as burdens placed society's welfare systems.

ISO 45001 is the first globally recognised international standard for occupational health and safety management systems. The standard provides a structured framework for proactively managing occupational health and safety to reduce risk, ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of employees and anyone else who may be impacted by an employer's work activities while supporting organisations with legislative compliance.

This course has been designed to explain what an occupational health and safety management system is, the status of BS OHSAS 18001, the structure of ISO 45001 and its requirements. The course will also explain the potential benefits of implementing a structured occupational health and safety management system.
